

# A YEAR OF GROWTH

Dear Members and Friends,

The Northampton County Historical & Genealogical Society (NCHGS) has worked very hard over the past century to serve as the center of art, history, culture, research, and discussion in Northampton County. The year 2022 showed us that this goal has truly come to fruition.

Early in the year we recognized that our area was experiencing a residential "boom" due to the COVID pandemic. In addition to welcoming new families and students to the County, we also quickly understood that our existing members and guests wanted a deeper level of discussion in our tours, programs, and exhibitions.

This new challenge created an exciting year of hard work for our entire team. We adapted programs, created new offerings, and made significant changes and updates to our existing activities. As a result, our "Eerie Easton Walking Tour" became sold out on most evenings. Our field trip program was streamlined and now better serves our area educators. Our galleries are filled with guests of all ages and backgrounds as they enjoy our permanent and changing exhibitions. The wine auction, held outside the Sigal Museum, was an incredible success as it shared the museum and downtown Easton with a new audience. I am happy to report that attendance is now exceeding pre-pandemic numbers.

Changes and growth would not be possible without help. I want to thank our members, volunteers, and Board of Trustees for supporting us as we worked to steer out of the COVID 19 pandemic. We truly could not do it without you!

There were many staff changes throughout the year. We said goodbye to Brad Davis as Curator of Collections & Exhibitions and Taylor Garrison as Outreach Assistant. We are thankful for their extremely hard work on the team.

## CATALOG PROJECT

- A large project to fully inventory the library collection and create a complete digital catalog of the materials was started in 2022. This will allow the catalogue to be accessible online for researchers.
- Large portions of the collection were reorganized. With help from library volunteers and interns, 175 new items were cataloged.
- 1900 items were barcoded and entered into the digital catalog.
- 1100+ previously digitized catalog records were updated and verified.
- A full shelf-read of the collection was conducted.
- The shelves were respaced to ensure proper storage and ease of access to the books.
- Duplicate book collection was accessed.
- Dozens of books from the library collection were transferred to the archive collection.
- The cataloging project will continue in 2023 with the help of interns and volunteers.

## TOXIC BOOK RESEARCH

- We completed a project to identify potentially hazardous books in the library collection. Specific clothbound books from the Victorian era were often colored with pigments containing lead, mercury, and arsenic.
- With the help of Lehigh University, we identified one book in our collection containing arsenic and several containing lead and chromium.
- Potentially hazardous books were bagged for the safety of volunteers, employees, and researchers.
- More books will be tested in the future.

# CURATORIAL



## PETER YDEEN "Easton Nights at the Sigal Museum"

"Easton Nights" is a temporary exhibition in the Sigal Museum's Chrin Gallery. It was designed and created in collaboration with local photographer, Peter Ydeen.

The exhibition features over 70 photographs which feature evening, urban landscape images. The images were taken throughout the cities, boroughs, and countryside in Northampton County. The exhibition closes May 2023.



## HIGHLIGHTS

- Thanks to a grant received from the County of Northampton, construction on visible storage began. This space on the third floor of Sigal Museum will allow the public to view objects in storage.
- A "deep clean" was started on the existing permanent exhibitions at Sigal and the historic structures.
- Work began to assist the Hellertown Fire Department with the conservation of a Victorian era parade banner.




# OUTREACH & EVENTS

# EDUCATION

## HIGHLIGHTS

- 375 students from the local community came through the exhibitions as field trips returned to Sigal Museum.
- NCHGS enjoyed hosting Third St. Alliance, Wilson High School, Calypso Elementary, Northeast Middle School, Moravian Academy, Williams Township Elementary, Bright Explorers Homeschoolers, Palmer Elementary, Stroudsburg homeschoolers, and Wilson High School.
- The traveling trunks were utilized during in-person and virtual educational programs. 700 students were served from three schools: Calypso Elementary, Harmony Elementary, and Easton Middle School.
- Five museum educators were hired to assist with the field trips. Welcome Ali Johnson, Nikki Mina, Gina Sampaio, Caitlin Dougherty, and Dustin Isenberg to the NCHGS team.

## YEAR ROUND

- Grab 'n' Go Kits: A dozen varieties of free DIY craft kits are available to kids and families.
- Heritage Day: Served 280+ participants at the Family Tent.
- Weekend Workshops: Served an average of 50 participants at each Easton Farmers' Market summer pop-up, staffed with volunteers.
- Winter Wonderland Arts & Crafts workshops: Over the course of five weekends, families attended free workshops in the auditorium.

## HISTORIC STRUCTURES UPDATE

### 1753 Bachmann Publick House

- NCHGS replaced the 1753 Bachmann Publick House's cedar shake roof.
- 238 guests enjoyed visiting the structure during the new Second Saturday programs.
- The Bachmann Players greeted 155 guests on Heritage Day for tours.

### Mixsell Illick House

- Structural analysis was started.
- Ceramics collection inventory was begun.

### Jacob Nicholas House

- Collections received a deep clean and over 100 guests enjoyed Heritage Day tours.

## HIGHLIGHTS

- The Sigal Museum's "History Here" exterior hanging banner and hardware was replaced. The new banner says "Sigal Museum" with the NCHGS logo at the bottom.
- Video surveillance cameras and recording equipment were installed at the Sigal Museum.
- Framed collections pieces are being relocated to visible storage spaces to optimize storage and provide more viewing opportunities for guests.
- Launched an addition to the permanent exhibition focusing on the history of the Black community in Northampton County.
- "Another Americans Autobiography" was deinstalled. "Easton Nights at the Sigal Museum" was installed.
- Grant funds helped purchase four beautiful display cases as well as build two large visible storage spaces on the Sigal Museum's 3rd floor.
